Bylaw Compliance

We have put a lot of attention into our research on Single use Plastic Bans across the country. There are already some Municipalities in BC that have established Single use Plastic Bag Bans into their By-Laws, with many more to follow (all). Our research shows that under the Vancouver ban (+What is Banned section) many biodegradable, compostable and organic bags will fall under these Bans.

A few other points to consider are; Solubags Non-Woven products completely comply with every By-Law Ban we have scrutinized, and are also considered compliant through discussions we have had with ECCC. Our bags are the least environmentally impactful (none) at "End of Life & Production", while most reusable bagson the market contain plastics or contaminants that will eventually do more micro-plastic damage in the future than is happening now. Retailers are also directed under the By-Laws to charge for Shopping Bags. (+ Bag fees and revenue section)

The last point, and probably one of the most important regarding business flow, is that Solubags Non-Woven products will allow you to purchase from one single source, at a fair, honest price, with the comfort of knowing your bags will be Ban acceptable Nationwide, without having to worry about the logistics of what different bags need to be shipped to which different locations.
